I recently learned that Dr. Roy Fish had died. Dr. Fish was an evangelism professor for many years at Southwestern Seminary and a few years ago was the interim President at NAMB. I had a chance to hear Dr. Fish at Mt. Pleasant during one of their mission conferences and it was good to renew acquaintances with him. You see, Dr. Fish was one of my very first professors at Southwestern. I had just returned from Liberia, West Africa serving as a missionary journeyman and enrolled at Southwestern for the fall semester. Dr. Fish was teaching Church Evangelism. Our first assignment was to read several chapters of a bookô which I did. However I just read it to check it off my list and didnøt really prepare for a possible quiz. At our next class session, Dr. Fish gave us a quiz over the material we had read. I failed that first quizô made a 68. It was my first test in two years and I wondered if I had made a mistake coming to seminaryô this was going to be tough. I still remember his words of advice and his challengeô always be prepared for every class, not just his. I took that challenge seriously and always tried to be prepared for every class. Sometimes that meant staying up late or getting up at 4:00 am but it was definitely a lesson I needed to learn early in

those seminary days. I am grateful for his ministry to me and to the thousands of other seminary students he taught at Southwestern Seminaryô he definitely made a lasting impact on them and through them to the various churches and countries around the world.

Thank you so much for your prayers for my brother. As most of you know by now he underwent surgery for stomach cancer in early September. They removed 60% of his stomach, several inches of his esophagus, lymph nodes around the stomach and esophagus, and gall bladder. He came home from the hospital nine days after the surgery and is doing well. He has a long way to go as you can imagine but I am grateful for the prayers you lifted up for him. Continue to remember him in your prayers as we see what the next steps will be for

I hope you are making plans to attend our Annual Meeting/Mission Celebration on Sunday night, October 14th at Tabernacle Baptist Church. Our theme this year is õBy Our Love.ö Last year over 600 were in attendance. It was exciting to see the 200+ mass choir and hearing them sing with one voice to our Lord.
