With the pandemic and many folks hesitant to get out, I was unsure how many items we might receive for this incredible ministry in our state. By the end of the day, however, I was overwhelmed by all the items our churches brought in-boxes and boxes of pancake mix, syrup, pop-tarts, oatmeal, grits, cereal and many bottles of water. There were also many snack items like crackers, cookies, honey buns, rice crispy treats, just to name a few. And we received gift cards, checks and cash that totaled almost \$1,700.00. Wow! What an incredible show of support for this ministry!

When the men came with the truck from the Children's Home they were stunned! They had been to another location on Monday, and picked up about 4 boxes of items. They could not

**Bowdon:** had a mission team go to Indiana to do work on a church.


Also had a "Family VBS" during the morning worship services July 12, 19 and 26th

## From the WMU


