Dear Dan and Carrollton Baptist Association,

I want to express my sincere appreciation to you for partnering with us in serving our community in the aftermath of Hurricane Florence. Hurricane Florence was devastating to our community. In fact, over 100 homes were flooded in the North Chase Subdivision where our family lives and where our church has been ministering. Only two of the homeowners in our subdivision had flood insurance. In addition, hundreds of trees fell causing roof damage to some homes. And this was just one of the subdivisions that was hit. While FEMA has provided some funds, it is the faith community that has been tearing out sheetrock, removing material to the curb, cutting and removing trees, and loving on and ministering to the homeowners.

We have been blessed to have churches come in and serve alongside us and also make donations, like Carrollton Baptist Association. We appreciate the donation of 10 gallons of Shockwave and the

check for \$4,209. Your financial gift will help provide gift cards and other items for homeowners who are desperately trying to recover and rebuild.

Thank you for being a part of what God is doing as we serve our community by being the hands and feet of Jesus. We have been receiving thank you notes from our community and a recent note brought tears to my eyes because the homeowner wrote, "When I think of you, I think of Matthew 25:35-40. I was a total stranger and you took me in." This is one example of the difference you are making here in Wilmington, NC! Again, thank you from the bottom of my heart. May God bless you!

From the WMU

December 2-9 is the Week of Prayer for International Missions. You can find resources for this year's theme "Every Church. Every Nation." at [https:// www.imb.org](https://www.imb.org). The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering supports our IMB missionaries. Every dollar you give makes a difference, because 100% of the money collected supports our missionaries and goes to the work of reaching every nation. Over 140 years ago while serving as a missionary in China, Lottie Moon wrote letters to the women where she had lived in America. She told them how she needed more missionaries to come and help her tell the Chinese people about Jesus. The women listened to Lottie and liked her idea. They saved their money and soon they had enough money to send three more missionaries to China. In 1918, Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) named the annual Christmas offering for International Missions after the woman who had urged them to start it. (There is a lot


more to Lottie Moon's life. Read more about her on the IMB's website. There are also some good resources at wmustore.com.) If you're looking for some interesting ways to build your Lottie Moon offering gifts I found some different ideas on a couple of websites. The first two ideas were posted on our Georgia Baptist Mission Board website (<https://gabaptist.org>). Put a bank on your kitchen/dining table and insert all extra change for the month. Be creative in how you save money. Consider what your family is spending on Christmas gifts. "Buy" Jesus a Christmas Gift by giving the amount to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering that your family is spending on its most expensive gift for Christmas. I also found some interesting ideas from a 2016 Missouri Baptist Convention post from their journal, The Pathway. Create a tax on a common item, building upon

the scripture Luke 2:3, "And all went to be taxed, everyone to his own city." (KJV). Example: church members are challenged to pay \$1 for each pair of shoes they own. This next idea has been around a while—set up a post office for handling Christmas cards among church members, with the cost savings from postage going to the Lottie Moon offering. One way to show your church's progression in meeting your offering goal is by enlarging a missionary photograph and cutting it into puzzle pieces, using each piece to represent monetary increments. Place one piece on the wall each time you receive a certain amount. You can find a few more ideas on our website at www.carrolltonwmu.com. Here's how your prayers and gifts transformed lives in the last year: 811 people groups engaged by IMB, 12,005 churches planted, and 46,495 people baptized.
