#### From the WMU

Sometimes it's hard to think of something to share in each month's article. I'll think-I already shared about that or I don't know if I can think of enough to write about a topic. I occasionally write about the same things again because I think it's important or someone new will see the information and it might spark an idea for them. This month I just wasn't sure what to write about. I often look at WMU materials including their website to get inspiration. I was excited to see an article written by Maegan Dockery, Dan's daughter-inlaw, who works with WMU in Birmingham. She had written an article titled 5 Ways to be On Mission during Summer Vacation. She shared some ideas she thought might work well for youth leaders and their youth groups.

**Volunteer in your community.** Volunteer somewhere locally in your community. You could help at a food bank or an animal shelter or anywhere you know of that needs some extra hands. Help with VBS. If there aren't specific lessons or events for your youth group planned during VBS, consider getting your students to help out where needed. This shows the students they can minister even within their own church family. Plan a party at a local nursing home. Find a day that works for your group and have a good old-fashioned ice cream social or another activity you might think of. Check with the activities director at the nursing home and find out what kind of event might be right for your group.

Encourage your students to begin a new ministry. Find out what things your students are passionate about or want to learn more about. They might consider starting a prayer ministry, where they could prayerwalk your church campus or surrounding neighborhoods. Let them explore their interests and empower them to get started. **Raise money for a cause.** Have a bake sale or a yard sale or whatever works best for your group. Have your students consider ways they could raise money for a local organization and let them lead it. Find a local ministry that could use your help and surprise them with your donation.

These ideas Maegan shared may also spark some ideas for women's groups too. This might just get you up and going during the summer days.

Your church mission group/groups. Please let me know if you would like to start some new groups in your church as the new church year begins. We can meet and talk and discuss some ideas.
