From Your Associational Missionary...

A story is told of two shoe salesmen being sent by a company to Africa. After a month in Africa the CEO of the company received two telegrams. One said, "Please send plane ticket, no one here wears shoes." The other telegram read, "Please send shoes, no one here wears shoes!"

Two men saw the same thing. One saw the problems. One saw the possibilities. One saw that no one needed shoes. One saw that everyone needed shoes. One came home disappointed. One stayed in Africa excited.

One of the great stories of Scripture that illustrates this is the woman at the well in John 4. The disciples saw a woman carrying a water pot coming to the well. Jesus saw a woman with a great need. The disciples were focused on buying groceries; Jesus was focused on sharing the gospel. The disciples didn't tell anyone about Jesus; but this woman told everyone she met. The disciples saw the problem—the people were Samaritans; Jesus saw the possibilities. And because Jesus saw the possibilities a whole village was changed.

Every time I hear this story and read this Scripture I am reminded that many times this is how we see our communities and our world. The needs are out there but some will see the problems while some will see the possibilities. Some will be discouraged because they feel like there is nothing they can do while some will be encouraged seeing that they can do something about it.

That's why I love Vacation Bible School, Children's Camp and Mission Trips. They each allow us to see the possibilities in our communities and our world. Many times VBS helps us to see our communities in a different light-we see children and families who have many needs, and have the opportunity to reach out to them during the week and the weeks following VBS. Children's camp allows us to focus on a specific age group-ages 9-12 and assist them in seeing that Jesus is the light of the world

who can meet their greatest need. It helps us to see the potential that exists in every child.

Mission trips allow us to leave our communities behind for a few days and see our world in a different way. Many times we come back changed with a new heart and mind to reach our mission field. We see the possibilities and not the problems.

So this summer, make sure you are praying for your week of VBS—over 200 decisions were made for Christ during that week in our association; for Children's Camp on June 27th-30th; and for all the mission trips our churches are involved in. And start looking at the

possibilities in your community and how you as an individual or church can make a difference.


