## From Your Associational Missionary...

While recently reading through the book of Joshua, I came across chapter 4 which follows the crossing of the Jordan River. God commands Joshua to choose 12 men, one from each tribe, to take a stone from the Jordan River, and to set up these stones as a memorial to the Lord. Joshua 4:6-7 says, "That this may be a sign among you, that when your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying what mean ye by these stones? Then ye shall answer them, 'That the waters of Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord; when it passed over Jordan, the waters of Jordan were cut off; and these stones shall be a memorial unto the children of Israel forever.' "

These stones were a reminder of how God had demonstrated His power and allowed the children of Israel to walk across on dry ground to bring them into the Promised Land. It was definitely a powerful reminder!

In life we have many reminders. A wedding ring is a reminder of

the commitment a husband and wife have made to each other. A birthday is a reminder that we are getting older but it also represents for Christians that we are another year closer to our heavenly home. A key is a reminder that we have a place to live and a vehicle to drive.

In the Christian life, we just celebrated Easter which is a powerful reminder that the grave is empty, sin and death have been defeated, Jesus is alive!
