discovers only one young lady has shown up and she has asthma. When he approaches the principal about the dilemma, she says "coach, one runner matters!" And she did! And because the coach invested time each day with that one young lady, she improved and was able to represent her school well!

That statement—"One Runner Matters" means one person matters. As I think about Jesus even though he preached to many in the synagogue, in a fishing boat, or on a hillside to the multitudes, you will also notice how one person mattered to Him. The paralytic who had four friends who brought him in Mark 2; the Samaritan woman in John 4: and the woman with an issue of blood who simply touched His robe and was healed. But you also see Jesus calling Matthew, the tax collector, and Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector. in a sycamore tree! And who can forget the healing of the leper, the blind man, the man with the withered hand, or the centurion whose servant was ill and at the point of

death. Even at the cross in His pain and agony He showed concern for His mother and the thief next to Him. Jesus, time and time again demonstrated that one person matters, that every person is important!

For us as Christ followers we demonstrate that one person matters when we pack a backpack or a shoebox for someone we might never meet but we know needs to hear about Jesus. That's why we fill a baby bottle with change, currency or a check because that mother and her baby matter. That's why we give to missions so others can go when we can't. That's why we pray for those who haven't found their way or purpose in life. That's why as we go we are alert for opportunities to share as we demonstrate we are a Christ follower through our words and actions.

"Coach, one runner matters!" "Christian, one person matters!" Who is that one person you can be praying for that God will open up a door for you to share? Dan
