I came across this devotional by Dr. David Jeremiah from his book, "Sanctuary." It definitely spoke to me especially as we prepare for our VBS Mission Project of translating the book of John for an unreached people group in West Africa

The Indestructible Word

"The grass withers, the flower fades, but the Word of our God stands forever." Isaiah 40:8

"Down through the centuries, the Bible has always been hated and scorned by God's enemies. Men have gone out of their way to abolish it.

There have been some "heroes" of God's Word. William Tyndale devoted his life to spreading God's good news. He translated it, printed it, and distributed it. In the midst of the great distribution under Tyndale, the bishop got angry and wanted to get the Bibles out of circulation. He sent a friend to buy all the Bibles Tyndale had printed. "Whatever it takes, buy them and destroy them." The friend talked Tyndale out of the Bibles in spite of Tyndale's exorbitant price. The

bishop's friend paid it, took the Bibles, and destroyed them. With the money from the Bibles, Tyndale bought materials to print thirty times as many Bibles and distributed them all over the country. When the bishop discovered more Bibles, he asked where Tyndale had gotten the funds to do this. His friend said, "You paid for it—you bought the Bibles and he distributed them."

Isn't that great! The Bible, defiantly, victoriously, convincingly, still stands. It remains the only inerrant, infallible, complete, revelation man has ever received from his living God."

This year for our VBS Mission Project we are partnering with the Seed Company and their Adopt A Verse ministry to translate the Book of John. Seed Company is working to bring God's Word to all people groups in the language they clearly understand by the year 2025. Of the nearly 7,100 languages in the world today, 1,671 languages (respresenting over 160 million people) do not have a single verse of the Bible. Their Bible is totally blank. So through this

Adopt a Verse ministry we are going to provide the Gospel of John (all 21 chapters and 879 verses) in one of the languages of the Manding Cluster in Northwest Ivory Coast in West Africa.

How does this work? For every \$25.00 raised a verse of scripture will be "adopted" by that church's VBS. The entire book of John will be in our office and when we receive your money we will write your church's name by a verse in John. So the more money raised, the more verses you will "adopt." Our association and three of our churches have already adopted a chapter so that is an option as well for your church. It will cost \$21,975 to do the entire book of John so other groups might want to pitch in and help with this project! I'm excited to know that the Word of God does stand forever and we have the opportunity of putting the Gospel of John into the hands of people for the very first time. I hope you will partner with us to make this a reality.

Around this time of year I want to encourage you to consider becoming more involved in missions through WMU. Soon you (and your church) will be planning for the new church year. I think most churches begin the time around August or September. There are several ways to promote missional living with children and adults with WMU resources. Maybe you have women that meet, but there are other opportunities for all age levels to be involved and learn about missions too. (If you start a new group please let me know and we can help with resources for six months for a new start.)

As I've mentioned before you can find so many wonderful resources on wmu.com. I find new things all the time. There is a video link on the right side of the homepage that provides a wonderful short overview to share with others in your church if you would like to get others on board to incorporate WMU resources. You can also find the same video link on

YouTube. Search for the title—Holistic Discipleship with WMU. It is a 3 minute, 49 second video.

There are five key areas WMU focuses on...Learn, Pray, Give, Serve, and Support.

WMU wants to work along with the church to accomplish the mission of God. WMU provides resources to learn about and pray for missions. Children can learn to apply their knowledge through giving, serving, and supporting missions. New Hope Publishers, a division of WMU, ministers and encourages readers to be involved and minister to others and study God's Word. Children, and adults, learn to pray for missionaries. WMU promotes giving to missions, especially through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for international missions and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American missions. WMU provides opportunities to serve by sharing

ideas monthly in the Mosaic magazine and also through mission experiences such as Family Fest, Missions Fest and Children's Ministry Day. WMU teaches us to **support** missions in a variety of ways. One program they sponsor is WorldCrafts. This includes fair-trade businesses among improverished people around the world. They also promote Pure Water, Pure Love. This program provides water filters to missionaries and areas around the world.

Christians are called to share the gospel to all people through word and deed. Being involved in WMU is one way to do that. I'll close with the vision of WMU which is to challenge Christian believers to understand and be radically involved in the mission of God.
