### From Your Associational Missionary:

I grew up a huge New York Yankee fan. In fact, one of my dreams was to play center field for them. My brother, Don, was a huge St. Louis Cardinal fan. We spent many hours of our childhood playing baseball in our backyard—Yankees against the Cardinals. Since we knew every player on each team, we would act out being one of them when we batted or pitched. Even though he was six years older than me, we still had some epic battles although I am sure I was on the losing end quite often.

I can remember on Saturday afternoons watching the Game of the Week on TV. It was great to see the Yankees take on the Cardinals or the Dodgers or the Red Sox. In college I had a chance to meet and hear Bobby Richardson who played second base for the Yankees. He spoke at an event that our Christian Students sponsored, and it was a joy to hear his testimony and the stories he shared about his playing days with the Yankees.

After graduating from college, I moved to Liberia, West Africa, from 1978-80. I arrived in Sep-

tember of that year-right before the baseball playoffs and World Series. A friend had given me a short wave radio so I could listen to Armed Forces Radio or Voice of America. I discovered the Armed Forces Radio did carry some baseball games so I listened to some of the World Series between the Yankees and the Dodgers. Only problem—we were 5 or 6 hours ahead so there were several late nights and early mornings. I was grateful for some of the games being played during the day! But it was worth it when the Yankees beat the Dodgers to be World Champs again.

One of the stars of the 1978 World Series was a second baseman by the name of Brian Doyle. Brian had taken the place of Willie Randolph, the regular second baseman, who was injured and unable to play. Brian along with Bucky Dent, the shortstop, were the catalysts for the team during the World Series. He always seemed to come up with a clutch hit or make an outstanding defensive play. Although I could not see the game—only listen, I could tell he was a very valuable member of that team.

A few months ago I had a chance to meet Brian Doyle at a missions conference at Roopville Road. What a joy it was for me to meet him and to discover that he is now involved in Global Baseball using baseball as a platform to share the Gospel in many countries around our world. It was great to hear stories from his playing days but it was even greater to hear how God was using him and others to take the message of Jesus Christ through Global Baseball.

After our conversation, I invited Brian to come share with us at our Pastor/Laymen Dinner on Monday night, September 30th at Rockridge. Later I realized that his message needs to be heard by more than just our men but by our sons and our daughters. We have changed the name to a Sportsmen Celebration Dinner and are inviting anyone who would like to come join us for this exciting evening. Cost is still \$10.00 a person and we will begin at 6:30 pm. I hope you will make plans to attend.

### From the WMU

#### Thank You

I would like to thank Midway Macedonia for hosting our Fall Missions Event. They made us feel right at home. I appreciated all of the ladies that joined us. I believe we all came away with a little more.... knowledge about our Project Help: Human Exploitation; areas we can pray for; mission action ideas; and encouragement for the new church year.

### Project Help

Wanda Lee, executive director/treasurer of national WMU stated at this year's Southern Baptist Convention that "for the past 125 years, WMU has remained focused on our singular purpose of engaging churches in missions. Throughout our history, addressing critical needs facing each generation has also been a part of our work. WMU has tried to raise the level of awareness of each issue within

the church while offering suggestions for how Christians should respond." Over the past three years, WMU has focused on various aspects of human exploitation, such as bullying, human trafficking, and exploiting the environment. During 2013, Mrs. Lee said WMU will focus on "One of the most significant issues related to human exploitation that is affecting our families and churches...the issue of pornography. Our president of national WMU, Debby Akerman, shared some statistics:

- Every second, more than \$3,000 is being spent on pornography.
- Every 39 minutes, a new pornographic video is made in the United States.
- There are at least 100,000 Web sites that offer illegal child pornography.
- The average age of a child's first exposure to Internet pornography is

- 11-years old.
- Of divorces, 56 percent involved one party having "an obsessive interest in pornographic Web sites." (source of stats 1-4: familysafemedia.com; Source of stats 5-6: covenanteyes.com)

In partnership with the Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission WMU is launching the Join One Million Men in the War Against Pornography campaign. "Through this campaign, we are calling out one million men to live free of pornography and challenging one million women to commit to pray for their spouses, sons, and friends as we work together to combat this evil that is destroying our families and invading our churches," Mrs. Lee said.
