From Your Associational Missionary...

One last update on our VBS Mission Project—to provide a boat, motor and trailer for an IMB missionary family in Brazil. Our goal was \$10,000. We have received over \$13,000 and we are expecting \$500 to bring the total to \$13,500. This will not only purchase the boat but will also provide fuel for several trips. Thank you to the 22 churches and several individuals who partnered with us to meet this need.

Thank you also for your tremendous response this past Sunday to the need in Nepal—providing shelters for those who lost their homes in the earthquake. Several of our churches have shared the amount collected and so far over \$5,000. has been received by our churches. Since our goal was for each church to provide one shelter (47 shelters @ 100.00), we have already exceeded our

goal!! To God be the Glory! Thank you for your generosity!

From the WMU

In last month’s article I shared about some training we’re going to have for our age leveled mission organizations. I began thinking some of you may not be familiar with the organizations that WMU offers from preschool age to adults. I’m sure I have shared some of the following information before, but I believe missions education is the heart of leading children to grow up understanding the importance of supporting our missionaries by praying, giving and going.

I would like to share a little about each age level. As you read this, please consider beginning a new group at your church. There are a lot of support materials to use for weekly lessons. If you don’t believe you have a weekly time available to incorporate missions you might have to get creative and see when you might be able to include mission education.

Mission Friends: From babies to kindergartners, Mission Friends provides the building blocks of faith and a basic awareness of God’s love for all people.

Girls in Action: is a missions discipleship organization for girls. Every girl in grades 1-6 can be a part of G.A. Through G.A., girls learn about, pray for, give to, and do missions work.

Royal Ambassadors: is a missions discipleship organization for boys in grades 1-6. Through hands-on activities that encourage spiritual growth, games and sports, and mentoring relationships with RA leaders, RA members become a faith-based brotherhood.

Children in Action: is a missions discipleship organization for children in grades 1-6. Every boy or girl has an important place in Children in Action. Members of Children in Action learn about and pray for missions. They do missions work and give money to missions. **Acteens:** is for girls in grades 7-12. Teenage girls have opportunities to grow in their relationships with God and their peers. Acteens learn to look beyond themselves and become actively involved in missions and ministry.

Challengers: is for boys in grades 7-12.

Youth on Mission: is a coed missions organization for students in grades 7-12.

myMISSION: is designed to help collegiate and young women to fulfill your mission as a follower of Christ. This online resource updates monthly.

Women on Mission: is ongoing missions involvement and learning that extends across the globe. Missions opportunities, learning materials and many free resources have been created to help women develop a missions lifestyle.

Adults on Mission: is for both men and women. Monthly updates to this site include the latest news on missionaries, mission work, and new projects among unreached peoples.

We would love for you to attend “A Morning of Missions” Saturday, September 12 at Macedonia Baptist, 1504 Macedonia Rd, Newnan, GA. This is for new and experienced leaders. We will be joining with the Western Association this year for our training. In addition to the age-level conferences there will also be a mission action/ministry conference you could choose to attend. 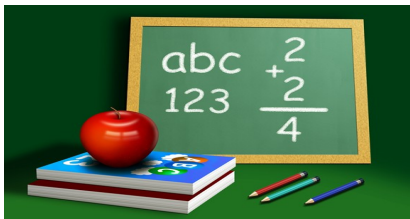
