From Your Associational Missionary...

Justin Richards and I have just returned from a vision trip to Peru. We had an opportunity to visit with John and Sonya Grady and several other missionary families in the Andes mountains of Peru. Both are native Georgians and met at West Georgia in the BSU. They have two young sons, Samuel who will turn 4 in December and Jacob who is 2.

We talked with John by phone at our Annual Meeting and discovered that he and Sonya had recently moved from South Peru to 7 hours north of Lima to a city called Huaraz. Huaraz is 10,000 feet above sea level and has a population of 125,000. This will not be their permanent home but while he serves as the team strategy leader for the Ancash Quechua and as he mentors some of the newer missionaries. Then he and Sonya and the boys will move to Huari sometime next year.

John was our chauffeur for the week and did an excellent job navigating through the mountains. Peru is made up of three different landscapes—desert on the coast which includes Lima; mountains which includes the Andes rising up to 22,000 feet at its highest; and jungle in the northeast. The roads wind their way up the mountains and some of the roads are totally paved, paved with many potholes, or just

gravel. The highest point where we traveled was 15,000 feet above sea level.

John took us to visit some of the missionary families who live several hours from one another. We carried each family some American chocolate and two of the young boys wanted Jolly Ranchers. They had not had any Jolly Ranchers for two years. When I brought out the two Ziploc bags full of Jolly Ranchers they were so excited. I wish I could have captured their reaction because it was priceless.

One of the goals of our visit was to see how we could partner with John and Sonya and the Ancash Quechua team. We know that there are many needs among these missionary families, and we wanted to see how we could encourage, affirm, and assist their ministry in Huaraz. In fact while Justin and I were there we were asked to bring a team of 6-8 who could care for the 11 children (ages 2-12) as they (the adults) meet together for several days of training. What a great way to encourage and assist these families. So we are now beginning to plan this trip for the first week of April. More details to follow.

As we met with each of these families—the Penningtons, the Bredbenners, the John-

sons and the Fleetwoods, we were impressed by their commitment and obedience to God's call. They knew God had placed them in their locations and they were faithfully serving Him there. They were also grateful for your prayers, and financial support that allows them to stay on the field and concentrate where God has placed them and their ministry to this unreached people.

November 28th through December 5th has been designated as the Week of Prayer for International Missions. Each church should have received a DVD about this week from the International Mission Board. It is an excellent tool to promote this week of prayer and to see some of the work and ministry around the world. I will also be sending you the names of the missionaries serving on the Ancash Quechua Team ministering to the Northern and Southern Conchucos Quechua people. We will be adopting this unreached people, praying that many will be reached for Jesus Christ in the days ahead. I also want to encourage you to give sacrificially to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering this year to help support the work of almost 5200 IMB missionaries around the world.




